## **Jesus' Workers of Compassion**

"When [Jesus] saw the crowds, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were troubled and downcast, like sheep without a shepherd." Matthew 9:36

Do these adjectives describe you? I think lately in one way or another we have all felt a little troubled and downcast. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus shows us one of


His strongest traits: His compassion.

The compassion of Jesus here in this account moved Him to do something about the hurt that was so prevalent- He sent His 12 disciples with power and authority, He sent them carrying His Word, His lifechanging message of salvation through faith in Him as the Son of God and Savior of the world.

This message is unlike anything the world can provide and, in a way, we can say that it is exclusively inclusive. We're told that in one sense, Christianity is the most exclusive religion in the world in that there is only one single way to be saved. Jesus Himself says in John chapter 14, "I am the Wav and the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father, except through me." Salvation is found in no one else. It's only Jesus. It isn't giving enough money, doing enough good, trying hard enough, it's only Jesus. It's only belief that He is the Son of God. That through His perfect life and sacrificial death on the cross our sins are forgiven and we get to enter through that narrow gate that leads to eternal

But in another sense, we can also say that Christianity is the most

inclusive religion in the world. Because while there is one way to heaven, that way is open for all, it's not dependent on anything we are or anything we do- it depends on Jesus.



that hard-to-stomach truth is not dependent on the color of your skin or what country your ancestors were born in. But just as we are all equal in deserving damnation, we are also equal in how valuable we are in the eyes of our God. When you look at someone who is different than you remember that God loves them in exactly the same way He loves you, a love so deep that it moved Him to send His one and only Son to suffer hell in their place, so that narrow path to eternal life could be open to them as well, just as it has been opened to you.

This is the powerful message that changes hearts and we are blessed to be able to share it! Pray that the Lord would send out workers into His harvest field. Pray for the workers already there. Continue to look for opportunities to talk about your compassionate, loving Savior with your friends and neighbors. During difficult times that cause us to be troubled and downcast, our Savior brings us the joy of our salvation and reminds us that while in this world, we will have trouble- but that we can take heart because He as overcome the world, and through faith has made His victory ours!





## Peace Lutheran Church COVID-19 Preparedness Plan for Indoor Worship June 14, 2020 Preamble

Minnesota churches were able to gather for worship May 27<sup>th</sup> and following. At this time, In-person worship services indoors are limit to 50% of capacity up to 250 if social distancing is practiced according to the guidelines of the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH). The guidelines strongly recommend the use of masks and the avoidance of congregational singing. Peace Lutheran Church, directed by God's Word, desires to worship God (3rd Commandment), honor the government (4th Commandment), and protect the health of those gathered for worship (5th Commandment). How to meet these obligations is being hotly debated by churches throughout the country. When dealing with issues like "How to worship in a COVID-19 world," it is not necessarily a matter of right or wrong, but of wisdom. Wisdom may determine that our approach changes with time and new data.

In the application of wisdom, Christians sometimes lay aside their freedoms for the good of a neighbor. St. Paul told the Corinthians that if eating meat would cause a brother to sin, he would never eat meat again (1 Co. 8:13). In connection with our situation, the fears and concerns of our neighbor should motivate us to act with loving restraint. The current wisdom is that we should gather for worship as safely as possible so that we limit the possibility of spreading the coronavirus at our assemblies. This may mean that we have to wear a mask, worship without singing, or make other considerations for the good of our neighbor.

With these things in mind, Peace chose to hold outdoor services May 31 through June 14 as the safest and most beneficial course of action. This gave the leadership of Peace time to develop a plan for indoor worship. The plan is outlined below.

There is one more factor in that needs to be recognized. No one plan will satisfy every individual's concerns. Some people are more conservative in their approach and others are more comfortable with risk. Some people will think that our plan is too liberal and at same time, others think it too strict. The following plan is not proposed as the middle road, but as a safe and most beneficial approach.

#### Worship Plan July 5th and Following

Peace will begin indoor worship services on July 5<sup>th</sup>. The 8:30 AM service will be indoor. The 10:00 AM service will be outdoor and continue to operate under the appropriate worship guidelines. On July 8<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday evening services will be added to the schedule.

If you want to continue to worship in your car, the audio from the Sunday morning services will be broadcast to the parking lot through our FM transmitter (FM88.1). To continue to support online worship, the 8:30 AM indoor service on Sunday will be live streamed. If you wish to watch after that time, the service will be available through our Peace website <a href="mailto:peacemankato.com">peacemankato.com</a>, the Peace Facebook page, and the Peace Vimeo archive <a href="mailto:vimeo.com/peacemankato/">vimeo.com/peacemankato/</a>.

Singing is an integral part of who we are and how we worship. Though there is some concern about singing increasing the spread of COVID-19, recent studies have brought that into question. It is the opinion of the leadership that the benefits of singing outweigh the risks. Therefore, singing will be a part of our worship services.

To ensure a safe and edifying indoor worship experience, the following guidelines will be followed:

- 1. If you or a family member:
  - a. have any symptoms of COVID-19 including fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, headache, muscle pain, sore throat or loss of taste or smell;
  - b. have been exposed to someone with these symptoms; or
  - c. have been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19,

please do not attend our in-person services until cleared by your doctor. We encourage you to take advantage of our online services.

- 2. If you are in a higher risk category for COVID-19, please use the drive-in service or worship online.
- 3. If you are not comfortable with the worship setting that these guidelines provide, please use our online resources.
- 4. Face masks are
  - a. required for the Sunday morning indoor service. (Families with children too young to wear face masks can worship in the designated area in the fellowship hall. Adults and children who are able are to wear masks in this area.); and
  - b. strongly encouraged but not required at the Wednesday evening service.
- 5. Register online to attend the indoor service at <a href="https://peacemankato.com/servicesignup">https://peacemankato.com/servicesignup</a> or call the church office 507-385-1386. If we reach the 100 person limit for attendance in our sanctuary, we will overflow to the narthex and the fellowship hall. If you have children that cannot wear a mask, please register for the fellowship hall area. The service will be projected onto the screen and there should be no delay between the audio in the fellowship hall and the sanctuary.
- 6. Social distancing (6ft) is to be practiced as you are coming and going from the service.
- 7. Ushers will be gloved and masked.
- 8. Ushers will ensure family groups remain separated by 6 feet. Seating will begin from the front to back to assist with social distancing. Please follow the directions of the ushers.
- 9. Single-use bulletins will be available but should be discarded or taken home after use.
- 10. The offering plates will not be passed during in the service. The plates will be in the narthex for you to leave your offering as you come or go from the service. If you participate in the drive-in service and online services, you can mail your offerings to the church office or give through our website <a href="mailto:peacemankato.com">peacemankato.com</a> or through the Peace app <a href="mailto:peacemankato.com/app">peacemankato.com/app</a>.
- 11. Bathrooms will be available inside the church. Proper social distancing still applies. Only one person (or members of one family) will be allowed in any of the bathrooms at one time.
- 12. After the service, wait to be dismissed by an usher. Attendees will be ushered out from back of the church to the front.
- 13. Socialization after the service is discouraged. If you do visit with others, be aware of your surroundings and practice social distancing. Visiting outside appears to be the safest option.

### Plan for the Distribution of Holy Communion

- 1. The elements will be prepared in a safe and sanitary process. The words of consecration will be spoken with the elements still covered. (The consecrated elements will be brought to the communicants in the fellowship hall and distributed appropriately.)
- 2. The pulpit side of the church will be communed first and the organ side second.
- 3. Communicants will line up in the center aisle, doing their best to follow social distancing.
- 4. Communicants are asked to sanitize their hands at the mobile dispenser in the aisle before receiving the elements.
- 5. Communicants will receive the elements in a continuous fashion. The pastors will not speak during the distribution.
- 6. Communicants will return to their seats by means of the outer aisles.
- 7. After all the communicants have receive the elements, the pastor will say the dismissal blessing.
